The 56th meeting of Empowered Inter-Ministerial Committee (EIMC) of NESIDS (OTRI) held at 11:30 AM on 29.04.2025 under the Chairpersonship of Secretary, MDoNER, through hybrid mode, to discuss the project proposals received from the State Governments of NER. List of the participants is at Annexure-I.

2. At the outset, the Secretary of Ministry of Development of North Eastern Region (MDoNER) and Chairperson of the Committee welcomed the participants and asked the Joint Secretary (Infrastructure), MDoNER to start the presentation. It has further been reported that the project came to a halt in 2019 due to issues relating to encroachments and construction of drain as per DPR in a few out of 54 bye lanes. Resulting to which, the department considered a change in scope, which eventually failed to materialize. In the interim, another department/agency took up the remaining work in the by lanes, utilizing their own financial resources to bring those specific elements to completion.	
After detailed deliberation the EIMC recommended the foreclosure of the project on as is where is basis.	

4. The Competent Authority has inter alia directed that the for the project "Development of Allied Infrastructure at Sainik School, Imphal, Manipur", the State Government may provide clarifications on the following points:

(i) It may be clarified whether the 100 bedded hostels are being constructed only for boys or for both boys and girls.

(ii) Regarding existing overhead tank, it may be clarified whether repairs have been explored by a professional agency or not, before proposing a new infrastructure.

(iii) Regarding boundary/ fencing, google image attached with proposal shows perimeter as 3.91 kms whereas DPR proposes construction of 3 KMs RCC wall (10 ft height) + 3 ft Concertina and 2. 02 Km Chain link fencing (approx. 10 ft height). However, no drawing / orientation of proposed boundary wall has been provided in the DPR. State Government of Manipur may provide the same.

(iv) The cost of Construction boundary wall appears to be almost 45% of project cost. It may be clarified whether technical alternative have been explored including barbed wire fencing/ CCTV/ sensor-based monitoring.

(v) Regarding construction of new water tank, it may clarified be whether alternatives have been examined including water supply by DWS deptt/ zincaluse/MS tanks.

The project may be taken up in the next EIMC subject to the compliance from the State Government of Manipur.

5. It was conveyed to the State Governments of NER to submit the project proposals against their normative balance outlays at the earliest as these outlays are valid till 31st March, 2026. The balance outlay of the State governments for NESIDS (OTRI) is summarized below:

6. It was further communicated to the State Governments that the expenditure plan shared by them for the period from April 25 to June 25 is in general on the lower side in respect of all the NER States. The State Governments were, therefore, requested to expedite the execution of ongoing works and submit the demand requests to the Ministry through the Poorvottar Vikas Setu portal.

7. The Committee reiterated that the State Government while submitting the new project proposals under NESIDS (OTRI) should provide the details regarding operationalization, maintenance and sustainability of the project along with all statutory clearances as per Annexure-B for Concept Notes and Annexure-C for DPRs, as per the guidelines of NESIDS (OTRI) issued vide No. NESIDS/4/20202-US(NLCPR) dated 21.08.2023.

8. Further, all the Project proposals, whether it is a Concept Note or DPR, the same is to be uploaded on the Poorvottar Vikash Setu Portal by the concerned agencies posing the projects which has already started functioning, and all ancillary processes starting from uploading of projects to sanction will be done through this portal.

9. All concerned Line Ministries and NITI Aayog were requested to expedite their comments for the project proposals those are being forwarded to them and furnish the same on time so that final decisions can be taken in the meetings without further delaying the process.

Lastly, the meeting ended with a vote of thanks to the Chair.
