Minutes of the 35th meeting of Inter-Ministerial Committee (IMC) / North East Special Infrastructure Development Scheme (NESIDS) Committee held on 24.03.2022 at 03:00 p.m. under the Chairmanship of Secretary, Ministry of Development of North Eastern Region through Video Conferencing (VC).

The 35th meeting of Inter-Ministerial Committee (IMC) / NESIDS Committee was held on 24.03.2022 at 03:00 p.m. to discuss project proposals received from State Governments of Arunachal Pradesh, Meghalaya and Nagaland for consideration of projects for sanction and for condonation of delay in issue of work order under North East Special Infrastructure Development Scheme (NESIDS). Chief Secretaries of the concerned States co-chaired the meeting. List of participants is at **Annexure-A**.

2. At the outset, Secretary, Ministry of Development of North Eastern Region (MDoNER) welcomed the Chief Secretaries and members of IMC / NESIDS Committee, representatives of State Governments and line Ministries of the Government of India. Thereafter, the Committee took up the project proposals for detailed discussion and recommended projects for sanction or condonation for delay in award of work appropriately, as detailed below:

ARUNACHAL PRADESH

- (i) Total Normative Allocation for FY 2021-22: Rs.129.29 crore
- (ii) Cost of Projects already sanctioned: 0

3. Project proposal: "Up-gradation of road from NH-13 to Ugyen Tsangpo Helipad at Tawang in Tawang district, Arunachal Pradesh" at an estimated cost of Rs.20.84 crore under NESIDS - For Sanction.

3.1 Chief Secretary, Arunachal Pradesh alongwith the officials of the State Government participated in the meeting through VC. Representatives of the State Government stated that the project was recommended for selection in the 33rd meeting of IMC / NESIDS Committee held on 18.01.2022. The proposal is for up-gradation of road from NH-13 to Ugyen Tsangpo Helipad at Tawang in Tawang District of

Arunachal Pradesh. The scope of work of the project includes formation work, pavement, cross drainage work, drains, protection work etc. The project will benefit incoming and outgoing tourists from Tawang. The report of Technical Board and Detailed Project Report (DPR) of the project has been vetted by North Eastern Regional Institute of Science & Technology (NERIST) and approved by State Level Empowered Committee (SLEC) in its meeting held on 23.03.2022.

3.2 Representative of Ministry of Road, Transport & Highways (MoRTH) at selection stage of the project had made certain observations on the proposal and suggested that geometric improvement shall be incorporated as per IRD: SP:48-1998-Hill Road Manual and IR:52-2019-Guidelines for the alignment survey and the EPC mode of contracts shall be adopted for improvement of geometrics of Hill Roads.

3.3 In response to the observations of MoRTH, the representative of the State Government stated that the DPR is based on Arunachal Pradesh Schedule of Rate 2021 for Roads & Bridges & analysis based on APAR 2021, which is the updated schedule of rate of Arunachal Pradesh PWD and is acceptable. Further, the specification for roads shall be as per provision in MoRTH specifications for roads and bridges. Subsequent to the detailed justification by the State Government, representative of MoRTH supported the project proposal.

3.4 Copy of final checklist-cum-agenda notes, as placed before the Committee, along with all its enclosures, is at **Annexure-B**.

3.5 After due deliberations, the Committee recommended the project proposal **“Up-gradation of road from NH-13 to Ugyen Tsangpo Helipad at Tawang in Tawang district, Arunachal Pradesh”** at an estimated cost of Rs.20.84 crore for Sanction under NESIDS, with the condition that all norms for implementation and sustainability of the project as prescribed by Ministry of Road, Transport & Highways will be adhered to by the State Government.

4. Project proposal: “Improvement of Water Supply System for Mechuka Township & Peripheral villages with Sewerage System and Riverfront development for boosting tourism in Mechuka Township, Arunachal Pradesh” at an estimated cost of Rs.34.99 crore under NESIDS –For Sanction.

4.1 Representatives of the State Government stated that the project was recommended for selection in the 33rd meeting of IMC/NESIDS Committee held on 18.01.2022. The project proposal is for improvement of Water Supply System for Mechuka Township & Peripheral villages in Shi-Yomi District, along with a provision

for Sewerage System and Riverfront development for boosting tourism of the area, for Sewerage flow of 1.0 MLD for the horizon year of 2051. The scope of work of the project consists of three components Water Supply System for Mechuka township and peripheral villages; Sewerage system of the same area and Riverfront development for boosting tourism of Mechuka town. The project will, inter-alia, fulfill the demands of tourist in quantity and quality and as such it would promote tourism and industry in the region.

4.2 For Water Supply projects and its ancillary works, Arunachal Pradesh Schedule Rates 2018 published by PHED have been used which is the updated schedule of rates of Arunachal Pradesh for PWD & PHED and is acceptable. The report of Technical Board and Detailed Project Report (DPR) of the project has been vetted by North Eastern Regional Institute of Science & Technology (NERIST) and approved by State Level Empowered Committee (SLEC) in its meeting held on 23.03.2022.

4.3 Representative of Department of Drinking Water and Sanitation at selection stage of the project had stated that State Government should adhere to provisions of operational guidelines for implementation of Jal Jeevan Mission (JJM) and that financial prudence to be ensured to avoid duplication of works and efforts. Representative of NITI Aayog had also queried about sufficient fund generation for up-keep and maintenance of the project.

4.4 In response to the observations of Department of Drinking Water & Sanitation and NITI Aayog, the representative of the State Government stated that the specification of the project shall be as per guidelines of Jal Jeevan Mission and there is no duplication of the project with the project implemented under any other schemes. Non-Duplication Certificate in this regard has also been submitted by the State Government. The increased inflow of tourist will help enhance the revenue which will be utilized for operation and maintenance component. Further, the sewerage system will be based on the gravity system hence, the operational and maintenance cost will be low. Subsequent to the detailed justification by the State Government, representatives of Department of Drinking Water & Sanitation and NITI Aayog supported the project proposal.

4.5 Copy of final checklist-cum-agenda notes, as placed before the Committee, along with all its enclosures, is at **Annexure-C**.

4.6 After due deliberations, the Committee recommended the project proposal "Improvement of Water Supply System for Mechuka Township & Peripheral villages

with Sewerage System and Riverfront development for boosting tourism in Mechuka Township, Arunachal Pradesh” at an estimated cost of Rs.34.99 crore for Sanction under NESIDS, with the condition that all norms for implementation and sustainability of the project as prescribed by Department of Drinking Water & Sanitation, Ministry of Jal Shakti will be adhered to by the State Government.

5. Project proposal: “Integrated Drinking Water project through hybrid of lift and gravity distribution system with value addition of Tourism components at Deomali, Tirap District, Arunachal Pradesh” at an estimated cost of Rs.39.61 crore under NESIDS –For Sanction.

5.1 Representatives of the State Government stated that the project was recommended for selection in the 33rd meeting of IMC / NESIDS Committee held on 18.01.2022. The proposal is for the installation of an integrated drinking water system through hybrid lift and gravity distribution system with value addition of tourism components at Deomali in Tirap District, for a projected peak demand of 1.06 MLD for the horizon year of 2053. The source of water for this project is river Charju, which is a perennial river with lean discharge of 0.0579 cumec. The project will improve the drinking water system of the region. Better drinking water facilities will boost tourism opportunities. Hence, the socio-economic parameters of the local populace are likely to improve. Because of the proximity of the project site with Assam and the scenic beauty offered by the forest and river, it has potential to attract lot of people from Assam as a destination for picnic and amusement.

5.2 The DPR is based on Arunachal Pradesh Schedule of Rates 2021 published by PWD for roads and bridges components and its ancillary works. For Water Supply projects and its ancillary works Arunachal Pradesh Schedule Rates 2018 published by PHED have been used which is the updated schedule of rates of Arunachal Pradesh for PWD & PHED which is acceptable. The specification of the project shall be as per guidelines of Department of Drinking Water & Sanitation, Ministry of Jal Shakti for water supply projects. The report of Technical Board and Detailed Project Report (DPR) of the project has been vetted by North Eastern Regional Institute of Science & Technology (NERIST) and approved by State Level Empowered Committee (SLEC) in its meeting held on 23.03.2022.

5.3 Representative of Department of Drinking Water and Sanitation at selection stage of the project had stated that State Government should adhere to provisions of operational guidelines for implementation of Jal Jeevan Mission (JJM) and that financial prudence to be ensured to avoid duplication of works and efforts. Representative of

NITI Aayog had also queried on proposal of operation and maintenance of project and asked State Government to clarify cost of the project as the estimated cost of Rs. 39.61 crore appeared on a higher side for 1.06 MLD water supply scheme and asked State Government to furnish an abstract of component wise cost break-up.

5.4 In response to the observations of Department of Drinking Water & Sanitation and NITI Aayog, the representative of the State Government stated that the specification of the project shall be as per guidelines of Jal Jeevan Mission and there is no duplication of the project with the project implemented under any other schemes. Non-Duplication Certificate in this regard has also been submitted by the State Government. Regarding operation and maintenance, the representative of the State Government stated that the energy requirement of the system will be met from solar energy with other conventional energy as stand-by only. The distribution of water to the consumers would be through gravity. Hence, recurring cost would be very minimal. For the upkeep of the system, the revenue that would be generated from the project itself would also contribute significantly, and there would be revenue accrued to the State exchequer through tourism components, as well as through water tariffs from the consumers. With regard to sustainability of sources, care would be taken to protect the sources from depletion by taking appropriate measures like water harvesting structures and awareness campaign, involving local Panchayat leaders, Administrative heads etc. In respect of the observations of NITI Aayog regarding cost of the project, the representative of the State Government stated that there are several reasons for increase in cost of the project, which inter alia, the distance of source of water supply which is around 20 km. Further, inclusion of tourism component in the project also contributed to the increased project cost, vis-à-vis other such projects. Subsequent to the detailed justification by the State Government, representatives of Department of Drinking Water & Sanitation and NITI Aayog supported the project proposal.

5.5 Copy of final checklist-cum-agenda notes, as placed before the Committee, along with all its enclosures, is at **Annexure-D**.

5.6 After due deliberations, the Committee recommended the project proposal "Integrated Drinking Water project through hybrid of lift and gravity distribution system with value addition of Tourism components at Deomali, Tirap District, Arunachal Pradesh" at an estimated cost of Rs.39.61 crore for Sanction under NESIDS, with the condition that all norms for implementation and sustainability of the project as prescribed by Department of Drinking Water & Sanitation, Ministry of Jal Shakti will be adhered by the State Government and MDoNER's share will be restricted to balance normative allocation of Rs.13.48 crore of the State of Arunachal

Pradesh for F.Y. 2021-22 and balance has to be borne by the State from its own resources.

6. Project proposal: "Construction of road from Shillong City to Umroi Airport under Ri-Bhoi district, Meghalaya (Length: 14.279 Km)" at an estimated cost of Rs. 50.00 crore under NESIDS - For sanction.

6.1 Chief Secretary, Meghalaya alongwith the officials of the State Government participated in the meeting through VC. Representative of the State Government stated that the proposed road starts from 2nd KM of Mawlai Bypass road and will connect Shillong city with Umroi Airport, passing through Umsaw, Umphrew and Umrynjah villages in a single stretch. It will be the shortest and most favoured route between Shillong city and Umroi Airport (the only airport in the State). The road will pass through picturesque landscapes, picnic spots scenic viewpoints like Sweet Hill's top and Lovely River bed, Sunshine farm and numerous guest houses and home stays. The main objective of the project is to attract national and international travelers to the State.

6.2 Representative of Ministry of Road, Transport & Highways had at selection stage of the project made observations regarding requirement of new road alignment in lieu of upgradation of existing road. In response thereof, State Government stated that upgradation of the existing road will require extra land, which is impossible as the certain stretch passes through thickly populated built-up areas and due to the typical topography at certain stretches. Moreover, a bridge on the pathway will also be required to be replaced for handling heavy traffic, if the existing road were to be upgraded. Subsequent to the detailed justification by the State Government, representative of Ministry of Road, Transport & Highways supported the project proposal.

6.3 Copy of final checklist-cum-agenda notes, as placed before the Committee, along with all its enclosures, is at **Annexure-E**.

6.4 After due deliberations, the Committee recommended the project proposal **"Construction of road from Shillong City to Umroi Airport under Ri-Bhoi district, Meghalaya (Length:14.279 Km)"** at an estimated cost of Rs.50.00 crore under NESIDS for sanction, subject to compliance to the norms of Ministry of Road Transport & Highways.

7. Project proposal: **"Improvement including widening of Agia Medhipara Phulbari Tura Road (Portion from 67/600 to 100/200 Km = 32.60 Kms), Meghalaya"** at an estimated cost of Rs.66.54 crore under NESIDS- For sanction.

7.1 Representative of the State Government stated that the proposed Agia Medhipara Phulbari Tura (AMPT) Road is an important and one of the oldest roads in the State of Meghalaya. The AMPT road is an inter-state road serving both the States of Meghalaya and Assam. The main objective of this proposal is to improve the AMPT Road by providing strengthening the existing pavement, pucca side drains, footpath with railing, protection and CD works and also earthwork on the road. Important tourist spots - viz., archaeological place at Wadagokgre and the Goddess Ma Charontola temple at Haldibari where many believers and devotees worship every year from different parts of the country - are enroute the AMPT Road. Visitors to the historical age old Maa Kamakhya temple at Mankachar in Assam also travel by the AMPT Road to worship the Goddess. The highest Peak Nokkrek in the region and the Balpakram National park are also very important tourist place of the district as well in the state of Meghalaya and the AMPT Road by its very location provides greater connectivity from the district to the other part of the country as well in the North Eastern state in particular.

7.2 Representative of MoRTH made certain observations on the project proposal and suggested that the geometrics of the project should be considered to be improved as per the National Highways Standard. In response thereof, State Government mentioned that the project proposal for upgradation of existing road will not be feasible to upgrade to the National Highways Standard due to want of extra land, acquisition of which will be difficult and will cause subsequent time delays and increase in the cost of the project. However, he assured that all safety requirements would be provided. Representative of MoRTH, after detailed justification by the State Government, extended support to the project proposal.

7.4 After due deliberations, the Committee recommended the project proposal "Improvement including widening of Agia Medhipara Phulbari Tura Road (Portion from 67/600 to 100/200 Km = 32.60 Kms), Meghalaya" under NESIDS for Sanction at an estimated cost of Rs.66.54 crore, subject to the condition that MDoNER's share will be restricted to balance normative allocation of Rs.52.87 crore of the State of Meghalaya for F.Y. 2021-22 and balance to be borne by the State from its own resources and compliance to the norms of Ministry of Road Transport & Highways.

8. Project proposal: "Construction of 23 Anganwadi Centre Buildings in Meghalaya" at an estimated cost of Rs.1.61 crore under NESIDS - For condonation for delay in award of work

8.1 The project was placed before the Committee for seeking condonation of delay in issue of work order. The representative of the State Government explained in detail the reasons/justifications for condonation of delay, which was mainly due to on-going Covid- 19 pandemic and change in location of the project (which has already been approved by competent authority earlier).

8.2 Copy of final checklist-cum-agenda notes, as placed before the committee, along with all its enclosures, is at **Annexure-G**.

8.3 After due deliberations, the Committee recommended condonation of delay in issue of work order in respect of the project "Construction of 23 Anganwadi Centre Buildings in Meghalaya" under NESIDS.

9. Project proposal: "Strengthening of health systems for the Management of CoVID 19 pandemic with special reference to combat the impending 3rd wave of the pandemic in Nagaland" at an estimated cost of Rs.19.96 crore - For Sanction.

9.1 Chief Secretary, Nagaland, along with the officials of the State Government, participated in the meeting through VC. Representative of Department of Health & Family Welfare briefed about the project and underlined its importance for enhancing the health infrastructure in the State.

9.2 Chief Secretary informed that after obtaining approval of State Level Empowered Committee (SLEC), State Government has come to IMC to consider the sanction of project under NESIDS. Committee observed that there is no deviation from the proposal as considered at selection stage. Representative of MoH&FW has stated that they have supported the project proposal. On query of component "Next Generation Sequencing for Diagnostics & Monitoring of SARS-COV-2 and other Infectious Diseases emerging in Nagaland", representative of State Government informed that as the facility is not available within the State, samples have to be sent to Imphal or Guwahati and samples become weak during the long transit. Hence it is crucial for the proposed genome sequencing lab within the State.

9.3 Copy of final checklist-cum-agenda notes, as placed before the committee, along with all its enclosures, is at **Annexure-H**.

9.4 After due deliberations, the Committee recommended the project "Strengthening of health systems for the Management of CoVID 19 pandemic with special reference to combat the impending 3rd wave of the pandemic in Nagaland" at an estimated cost of Rs.19.96 crore for sanction under NESIDS.

10. Project proposal: "Implementation of Educational Infrastructure related to IT projects in 190 schools across Nagaland" at an estimated cost of Rs.19.79 crore - For Sanction.

10.1 Representative of Department of Education of the State Government briefed about the project and informed that the project is a two way real-time digital learning ecosystem in 190 schools through smart classrooms which will connect to the studio, from where multiple sessions can run simultaneously with LIVE and interactive expert-led teaching.

10.2 Representative of Ministry of Education supported the project proposal of the State Government.

10.3 Copy of final checklist-cum-agenda notes, as placed before the committee, along with all its enclosures, is at **Annexure-I**.

10.4 After due deliberations, the Committee recommended the project proposal "Implementation of Educational Infrastructure related to IT projects in 190 schools across Nagaland" at an estimated cost of Rs.19.79 crore for Sanction under NESIDS.

11. Project proposal: "Construction & Up-gradation of Glory Peak Tourist Road under Phek district (9.6 km)" at an estimated cost of Rs. 32.50 crore under NESIDS - For Sanction

11.1 Representatives of the State Government presented that the proposed project starts from NH29 Pfutseromi Gate Jtn. and ends at NH29 Chobama Jtn., and is 64 Kms away from the State capital, Kohima. The proposed road will lead to the highest point in Pfutsero Town, which offers majestic view of all the surrounding villages. It connects the trekking road to Kepamodzu forest, which attracts both domestic and foreign tourists. The road also passes near the historic Japan Cave, which the Japanese Army used during World War II and is still visited by scholars and tourists alike.

11.2 On query of safety measures like crash barriers, speed limits, sign boards etc required for low traffic road by representative of MoRTH, Chief Engineer, PWD(R&B) assured the Committee that all safety measures have been taken care of in the DPR. Representative of MoRTH also asked the rationale behind choosing the WBM base road, and not cement treated base road. Chief Engineer, PWD(R&B) informed that this road is not a low traffic road and raw material for cement treated base has to be procured from out side the State, which causes time delays and cost escalation ; whereas raw material for WBM base is available onsite. On the issue of mode of execution of work State Government representative confirmed that this would be done on EPC mode. Representative of MoRTH, after detailed justification by the State Government, extended support to the project proposal.

11.3 Copy of final checklist-cum-agenda notes, as placed before the Committee, along with all its enclosures, is at **Annexure-J**.

11.4 After due deliberations, the Committee recommended the project proposal "Construction & Up-gradation of Glory Peak Tourist Road under Phek district" at an estimated cost of Rs.32.50 crore for Sanction under NESIDS.

12. Projects proposal: "Improvement of road from Longnak to Mangkolemba Town" at an estimated cost of Rs.29.99 crore under NESIDS - For Sanction.

12.1 Representative of the State Government stated that the proposed road starts from Longnak and ends in the heart of Mangkolemba Town. The road is a Major District Road (MDR). State Government is proposing the upgradation of road into intermediate standard road from existing single lane road. The proposed road leads to Jangpetkong range, connecting Molung Kimong village which is a tourist designated village, as well as a site for religious tourism.

12.2 On query of safety measures like crash barriers, speed limits, sign boards etc required for low traffic road by representative of MoRTH, Chief Engineer, PWD(R&B) assured the Committee that all safety measures have been taken care of in the DPR. Representative of MoRTH also asked the rationale behind choosing the WBM base road, and not cement treated base road. Chief Engineer, PWD(R&B) informed that this road is not a low traffic road and raw material for cement treated base has to be procured from out side the State, which causes time delays and cost escalation ; whereas raw material for WBM base is available onsite. On the issue of mode of execution of work State Government representative confirmed that this would be done on EPC mode. Representative of MoRTH, after detailed justification by the State Government, extended support to the project proposal.

12.3 Copy of final checklist-cum-agenda notes, as placed before the Committee, along with all its enclosures, is at **Annexure-K**.

12.4 After due deliberations, the Committee recommended the project proposal "Improvement of road from Longnak to Mangkolemba Town" at estimated cost of Rs.29.99 crore for Sanction under NESIDS subject to the condition that MDoNER's share shall be restricted to balance normative allocation of Rs.28.53 crore of the State of Nagaland for F.Y. 2021-22 and balance is to be borne by the State Government from its own resources.
