Minutes of 47th meeting of Empowered Inter-Ministerial Committee (EIMC) of NESIDS(OTRI) and Special Development Packages of Autonomous Councils of Assam held on 06.05.2024 at 11:30 AM under the Chairpersonship of Secretary, Ministry of Development of North Eastern Region and Co-Chairpersonship of Chief Secretaries of the concerned NE States through hybrid mode.

The 47th meeting of Empowered Inter-Ministerial Committee (EIMC for North East Special Infrastructure Development Scheme (NESIDS)-OTRI and Special Development Packages of Autonomous Councils of Assam was held on 06.05.2024 at 11:30 a.m. to discuss project proposals received from State Governments of Arunachal Pradesh, Assam, Manipur, Meghalaya, Mizoram, Nagaland, and Tripura for consideration for in Principle Approval/Approval of DPRs. 2. At the outset, Secretary, Ministry of Development of North Eastern Region (MDoNER) and Chairperson of the Committee welcomed the representatives of State Governments and members of Committee and line Ministries of the Government of India.

Rest of the project proposals and DPRs were deferred for want of comments of the NITI Aayog / concerned line Ministries.

In 46th EIMC meeting, the Competent Authority had directed that for (i) Development of infrastructure at Shirui Heritage village and Bakshi Ground at Ukrul District (Rs. 60.00 cr) and (ii) Development of Rural Tourism at Andro Village, Imphal East (Rs. 20.00 cr) projects, the State Government of Manipur should examine and ensure convergence with the existing facilities and optimize the cost accordingly; and for the Sports project of Tripura, the State Govt. should examine the output and outcome of the project at the concept note stage as suggested by the NITI Aayog. The State Governments of Manipur and Tripura had provided clarifications on the observations made by the competent authority which were placed before the 47th Empowered Inter-Ministerial Committee(EIMC) in its meeting held on 6th May,2024. The competent authority has made observations in respect of aforesaid three projects. The concerned State Governments are requested to send the replies to these observations.

4. Further, the EIMC reiterated that the State Governments while submitting the new project proposals under NESIDS (OTRI) should provide the details regarding operationalization, maintenance and sustainability of the project along with all statutory clearances as per **Annexure-B** for Concept Notes and **Annexure-C** for DPRs, as per the guidelines of NESIDS (OTRI) issued vide No. NESIDS/4/20202-US(NLCPR) dated 21.08.2023.

5. Further, from now onwards, all the Project proposals, whether it is Concept notes or DPRs, the same to be uploaded on the Poorvottar Vikash Settu Portal which has already started functioning, by the concerned agencies posing the projects and all ancillary processes starting from uploading of projects to sanction will be done through this portal only.

6. The status of state-wise pending UCs and also the funds lying in CNA Account were reviewed and states were advised to take prompt action for submission of pending UCs and also to draw funds from CNA accounts so as to facilitate for release of additional funds for the projects.

7. The meeting ended with a vote of thanks to the Chair.
