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**Minutes of the 41<sup>st</sup> meeting of Empowered Inter-Ministerial Committee (EIMC)/NESIDS-OTRI and Special Development Packages of Autonomous Councils of Assam held on 26.09.2023 under the Chairmanship of Secretary, Ministry of Development of North Eastern Region and Co-chairpersonship of Chief Secretaries of the concerned States through hybrid mode.**

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The 41<sup>st</sup> meeting of Empowered Inter-Ministerial Committee (EIMC)/North East Special Infrastructure Development Scheme- Other than Road Infrastructure (NESIDS-OTRI) and Special Development Packages (SDPs) of Autonomous Councils (ACs) of Assam was held on 26.09.2023 to discuss project proposals received from State Governments of Arunachal Pradesh, Assam, Manipur, Meghalaya, Mizoram, Nagaland and Tripura for consideration of projects for selection/ approval under NESIDS (OTRI) and SDPs of ACs and other miscellaneous issues in respect of the ongoing projects under NLCPR/NESIDS. List of participants is at **Annexure-I**.

2. Welcoming the participants, Secretary (MDoNER) stated that a total of 17 DPRs, received from the States against 28 Projects already approved in principle in the EIMC meetings of NESIDS(OTRI) earlier, is for consideration and that these proposals have been shared with the relevant Central line Ministries. Further DPRs of 3 projects under BTC package are also placed for consideration; in principle, approval was given in the IMC meeting held earlier. Also for consideration, are 13 proposals prioritized and posed by Assam under BTC and KAATC package by Chief Secretary, Assam for in principle approval. The Government of Assam also presented two projects of NLCPR for approval of change in scope of work/ splitting of work without changing the approved cost of the projects.

3. The project-wise detailed deliberations and recommendations of the EIMC are summarised as under:
