# Minutes of 50<sup>th</sup> meeting of Empowered Inter-Ministerial Committee (EIMC) of NESIDS (OTRI) held on 22.10.2024 at 03:30 PM under the Chairpersonship of Secretary, Ministry of Development of North Eastern Region

The 50<sup>th</sup> meeting of Empowered Inter-Ministerial Committee (EIMC) of NESIDS (OTRI) was held on 22.10.2024 at 03:30 PM under the Chairmanship of Secretary, MDoNER, through hybrid mode, to discuss project proposals received from State governments of NER. List of the participants is at Annexure-I.

2. At the outset, Secretary, Ministry of Development of North Eastern Region (MDoNER) and Chairperson of the Committee welcomed the participants and directed the Joint Secretary (Infrastructure), MDoNER to start the presentation. The Agenda-wise deliberations and decisions were taken as follows:

## Agenda No. I: Confirmation of the Minutes of the 49th EIMC of NESIDS(OTRI)

The Minutes of the 49<sup>th</sup> Meeting were issued on 20<sup>th</sup> September 2024. As there were no comments received from the State Government, therefore the Minutes of the last meeting were confirmed.

## Agenda No. II: Action taken report of the decision of the 49th EIMC of NESIDS(OTRI)

It was informed that 8 project proposals were considered for In-Principle approval, 3 project proposals were considered for DPR approval, 3 proposal were considered for change of scope and 2 proposals for Condonation of delay were considered in 49th meeting of EIMC held on 10.09.2024. During the meeting, DPR of 1 project was recommended for approval for which AFS has been issued and 2 proposals were approved in-principle and the decision was conveyed to the State Government through the Minutes of Meeting issued on 20.09.2024. Further, the change of scope for one proposal was approved for which revised AFS has been issued and for another 2 proposals condonation of delay was approved and the decision was conveyed to the State Government through the Minutes of Meeting issued on 20.09.2024.

3. The competent authority has inter alia directed that for the project "Implementation of Educational Infrastructure Related to IT Projects In 220 Schools Across Mizoram" the State Government should provide clarification on the following points:

(i) As per the DPR, enrolment in all schools (upper primary/secondary) is in range of 30 to 50 students. State Government may clarify whether infrastructure expenditure is justified in these schools.

(ii) The outcome of project in terms of learning is not clearly quantified in the DPR. The same may be provided.

(iii) It is observed that V-SAT has been provisioned for all 220 Schools, whereas provision of 4G Connectivity in the schools can be examined.

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(iv) It may be clarified whether the expenditure on infrastructure related to IT projects will result in lowering outgo on Teacher Salary expenses. If so, the same may be quantified.

(v) The PERT chart of the projects indicating the timelines for completion of Project may be provided.

4. It was conveyed to the State Governments of NER that the pace of expenditure on the ongoing projects under the schemes of MDoNER is quite low. They were requested to prepare an expenditure plan for incurring an expenditure of Rs 1858.16 cr by 31<sup>st</sup> October 2024 and submit the demand requests on Vikas Setu Portal as per the following state-wise and scheme wise targets:

5. The Committee reiterated that the State Government while submitting the new project proposals under NESIDS (OTRI) should provide the details regarding operationalization, maintenance and sustainability of the project along with all statutory clearances as per Annexure-B for Concept Notes and Annexure-C for DPRs, as per the guidelines of NESIDS (OTRI) issued vide No. NESIDS/4/20202-US(NLCPR) dated 21.08.2023.

6. Further, all the Project proposals, whether it is a Concept Note or DPR, the same is to be uploaded on the Poorvottar Vikash Setu Portal by the concerned agencies posing the projects which has already started functioning, and all ancillary processes starting from uploading of projects to sanction will be done through this portal.

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7. The status of project-wise pending UCs were reviewed, and State Governments were advised to take prompt action for submission of pending UCS. Further, the Program Division was also directed to take immediate action on the documents that are being received from the States.

8. All concerned Line Ministries and NITI Aayog were requested to expedite their comments for the project proposals those are being forwarded to them and furnish the same on time so that final decisions can be taken in the meetings without further delaying the process.

9. Lastly, the meeting ended with a vote of thanks to the Chair.
