Minutes of the 24th meeting of Inter-Ministerial Committee (IMC)/NESIDS Committee held on 22.12.2020 at 03:00 p.m. in the Committee Room (Room No. 243-A), Vigyan Bhawan Annexe, New Delhi under the chairmanship of Secretary, Ministry of DoNER.

1. The 24th meeting of Inter-Ministerial Committee (IMC)/NESIDS Committee was held on 22.12.2020 at 03:00 p.m. to discuss:-
 - a. Project proposals received from State Governments of Arunachal Pradesh, Manipur, Meghalaya, Mizoram and Tripura for sanction;
 - b. Project proposals received from State Governments of Nagaland and Tripura for selection;
 - c. Two projects of State Government of Arunachal Pradesh and one project of State Government of Meghalaya for change in scope of work.

Chief Secretaries of Arunachal Pradesh, Manipur, Meghalaya, Mizoram, Nagaland and Tripura co-chaired the meeting. List of participants is at **Annexure I**.

2. In the introductory remarks before taking up the specific agenda items for discussion, Secretary, MDoNER drew the attention of Chief Secretaries and other officials of State Governments (SGs) towards non-submission of proposal(s) from some of the States for sanction against their balance of normative allocation under NESIDS. It was underlined during the discussion that if no proposal(s) was received by the next meeting of IMC/NESIDS Committee which is likely to be held by mid of January, 2021, the balance of normative allocation of that State(s) under NESIDS will be transferred to those states who have already submitted more projects/have the additional capacity/or MDoNER has allowed part funding of some of their projects due to less availability of normative allocation. **The Committee decided to recommend the same for approval of Competent Authority.**

3. Thereafter, the Committee took up each of the projects for detailed discussion and recommendations as detailed below:

ARUNACHAL PRADESH

4. **Project proposal :“Procurement of equipment for District Hospitals & CHCs (Pakke Kessang, Likabali, Basar, Shi Yomi, Boleng, Raga, Doimukh, Palin, Koloriang, Daporijo, Anini, Roing, Anjaw and Longding) in Arunachal Pradesh” under NESIDS - For Sanction.**

4.1 The project proposal was recommended in the 23rd meeting of IMC/NESIDS Committee, for selection at a tentative cost of Rs.23.51 crore subject to preparation of the DPR in consultation with MoH&FW and incorporation of their suggestions, finalization of cost as per DPR and the condition that MDoNER's share will be restricted to

available normative allocation of the State, i.e. Rs.18.18 crore or cost as per DPR, whichever is lower, and balance, if required will be borne by the State Government.

4.2 Ministry of Health & Family Welfare (MoH&FW) after examining the project proposal costing Rs.23.51 crore excluded some of the items and reduced the cost of the proposal to Rs.8.56 crore. Keeping in view of the recommendations of MoH&FW, the State Government revised the project proposal. The revised project proposal costing Rs.22.72 crore submitted by the State Government of Arunachal Pradesh comprises items recommended by MoH&FW, GoI at cost of Rs.8.56 crore and additional items *viz.* 32 slice CT Scan machine (3 units @ Rs.4.00 crore) costing Rs.14.16 crore (including GST@18%). The revised project proposal costing Rs.22.72 crore was approved by SLEC in its meeting held on 18.11.2020 subject to the condition that the same is vetted by MoH&FW and share of MDoNER is restricted to Rs.18.18 crore and balance to be borne by State Government.

4.3 The Chief Secretary, Arunachal Pradesh, alongwith Officials of Health and Planning Department of State Govt. participated in the meeting through Video Conferencing (VC).

4.4 During the deliberation, MoH&FW requested the State Government to clarify whether the 'Operation Theater equipment' *viz.* Autoclave for Daporijo District Hospital will be procured under NHM or NESIDS. In response thereof, State Government submitted that the procurement of Autoclave for Daporijo DH will be made from NHM and hence may be excluded from the current proposal. In response to the observations of NITI Aayog, State Government further stated that there is no duplication in the districts for which hospital equipments were sanctioned under NESIDS earlier for strengthening health infrastructure.

4.5 In view of the clarification from the State Government, MoH&FW and NITI Aayog supported the proposal.

4.6 Copy of Final Checklist cum Agenda Notes, as circulated/placed before the committee (along with all its enclosures) and PPT by State Government are at **Annexure IIA and IIB** respectively.

4.7 After due consideration of the proposal and detailed deliberations, the Committee recommended the project proposal of State Govt. of Arunachal Pradesh for sanction at a tentative cost of Rs.22.70 crore (excluding Autoclave for Daporijo DH costing Rs.2.00 lakh) subject to the condition that MDoNER's share will be restricted to available normative allocation of the State i.e. Rs.18.18 crore and balance, will be borne by the State Government.

5. Project of proposal: "Renovation, modernization and improvement of T & D system i/c Sub-Station of Bhalukpong, Kalaktang & Dirang and their adjacent areas in West Kameng district of Arunachal Pradesh" under NLCPR - For change in scope of work.

5.1 The Committee noted that SLEC in the minutes of meeting held on 16.09.2020 has approved the change in scope of work in the project after accepting the justification given by the executing Department.

5.2 Representative of Ministry of Power supported the proposal of State Government.

5.3 Copy of Final Checklist cum Agenda Notes, as circulated/placed before the committee (along with all its enclosures) is at Annexure III.

5.4 After due consideration of the proposal of the State Government and detailed deliberations, the Committee recommended the proposal of change of scope of the work.

6. Project proposal : "Construction of road from Kheti to Dadam (21 KM)" under NLCPR scheme- For change in scope of work.

6.1 The Committee noted that SLEC, in the minutes of meeting held on 16.09.2020, has approved the change in scope of work in the project after accepting the justification given by the executing Department.

6.2 During deliberations, the State Government, also clarified the observations of Ministry of Road Transport & Highways, while also stating that the project is physically completed. Their clarifications were found satisfactory by the Committee.

6.3 Copy of Final Checklist cum Agenda Notes, as circulated/placed before the committee (along with all its enclosures) is at Annexure IV.

6.4 After due consideration of the proposal of the State Government and detailed deliberations, the Committee recommended the proposal for change in scope of the work.

MANIPUR

7. Project proposal: "Construction of District Hospital Imphal West at Mayang in Manipur" under NESIDS- For Sanction.

7.1 The project proposal was selected in the 23rd meeting of IMC/NESIDS Committee subject to the condition that the State Govt. of Manipur should make a

compact proposal and consult with MoH&FW while preparation of DPR and duly incorporate their suggestion/concerns while finalizing the proposal.

7.2 The revised project proposal was recommended by the SLEC at cost of Rs.65.00 crore, limiting the funding by Ministry to Rs.53.40 crore, as per normative allocation of the State and balance to be taken up under State funding.

7.3 The Chief Secretary, Manipur alongwith officials of Health and Planning Department of State Govt. participated in the meeting through Video Conferencing (VC) and gave details of the revised project proposal.

7.4 Copy of Final Checklist cum Agenda Notes, as circulated/placed before the committee (along with all its enclosures) is at **Annexure V**.

7.5 During the meeting, attention of the Committee was drawn to letter dated 22.12.2020 received from MoHFW, a few hours before the meeting, in which MoHFW had recommended the project while curtailing the cost of the project drastically to Rs 38.01 crores (Rs 33 cr for Civil works; Rs 3 cr for equipment; Rs 1.23 cr for Mortuary and Rs 0.78 cr for Staff Quarters). This amounts to a large reduction in Civil construction cost. The basic reason for the same appears to be certain norms of MoHFW, in which thumb-rule estimates are used for arriving at size of hospital vis-à-vis no. of patient beds, and some fixed rates are then used for calculating construction costs, based on the estimated hospital size. The Committee was of the view that such estimated dimensions and rates do not accurately represent the ground situation, and the construction cost of a designed hospital building should be estimated based on SoR, which has been done in this case. The only variance deserving discussion would, therefore, be if the design of the hospital is far in excess, in terms of dimensions, as compared to the norms of MoHFW. It was decided to constitute sub-Committee to study this aspect, comprising Joint Secretary (NLCPR/NESIDS); representatives from NITI Aayog, MoH&FW, GoI, Central Public Works Department (CPWD); Principle Secretary (Health), Govt. of Mizoram; Deputy Secretary (IFD, MDoNER) and Superintending Engineer, MDoNER. The scope of the Committee would be **only** to study the variation in dimensions of the proposed design of the hospital, vis-à-vis norms of MoHFW, considering the number of patient beds, and not to go into aspects of variation in costs, which would be based on SoR once the design dimensions are finalized.

7.6 After due deliberation, the Committee approved the project with the rider that the cost of the project to be borne by MDoNER would be limited to the the lower of (i) balance Normative Allocation of the State Govt. under NESIDS (i.e. Rs 53.40 crore), or (ii) the cost of the project arrived at based on the design dimensions which would emerge in the report of the sub-committee and calculated based on SoR rates.

MEGHALAYA

8. Project proposal: "Greater Baghmara Water Supply Scheme" under NESIDS- For Sanction

8.1 The Chief Secretary, Meghalaya, along with Officials of State Govt. participated in the meeting through Video Conferencing (VC). The State Govt. gave a detailed explanation on the salient features of the proposal.

8.2 During deliberations the State Government addressed the observations of NITI Aayog on the project proposal which were found satisfactory.

8.3 Copy of Final Checklist cum Agenda Notes, as circulated/placed before the committee (along with all its enclosures) is at **Annexure VI**.

8.4 After due consideration of the proposal and detailed deliberations, the Committee recommended the project proposal of State Govt. of Meghalaya for sanction at the cost of Rs. 63.50 crore subject to the conditions that MDoNER's share will be restricted to Rs.47.54 crore and balance to be borne by the State Government from its own resources.

9. Project proposal : "Proposal for Police Integrated Welfare Complex" under NLCPR- For Change in scope alongwith cost revision

9.1 The representatives of the State Govt. gave detailed the salient features of the proposal. It was brought to the notice of the Committee that the project was sanctioned at cost of Rs.12.85 crore. Later, the cost of the project was revised to Rs.17.21 crore by omitting the components viz. Sports Complex, Hospital and Cost of Ambulance but the funding by MDoNER under NLCPR was restricted to Rs.11.57 crore (90% of the sanctioned cost of project i.e. 12.85 crore) and the balance amount of Rs.5.64 crore to be borne by the State Government.

9.2 NITI Aayog supported the proposal for change in scope along with cost revision.

9.3 Copy of Final Checklist cum Agenda Notes, as circulated/placed before the committee (along with all its enclosures) is at **Annexure VII**.

9.4 After due consideration of the proposal and detailed deliberations, the Committee recommended the project proposal of State Govt. of Meghalaya for change in scope alongwith cost revision at a cost of Rs.17.21 crore by omitting the components viz. Sports Complex, Hospital and Cost of Ambulance but the funding by MDoNER under NLCPR will restricted to Rs.11.57 crore (90% of the sanctioned cost of project i.e.12.85 crore) and the balance amount of Rs.5.64 crore to be borne by the State Government.

MIZORAM

10. Project proposal: "Improvement & Up-gradation of Difference facilities at Lengpui Airport, Mizoram" - for sanction under NESIDS at a cost of Rs.19.59 crore.

10.1 The project was recommended for selection in the 23rd meeting of IMC/NESIDS Committee at the cost of Rs.30 crore with the condition that while preparing the DPR, the State Govt. will keep on board a representative of Airport Authority of India (AAI) to look into the technical aspects of the project.

10.2 The State Government subsequently decided to delete certain items from the scope of the project, to bring the cost in line with the amount to be funded by MDoNER, as decided at the selection stage for the project (i.e., Rs 19.59 crore).

10.3 The SLEC vetted and recommended the project for sanction at a cost of Rs.19.59 crore. The representatives of the State Govt. of Mizoram present during the meeting made a detailed justification on the project proposal during the meeting and also clarified that specifications are as per latest IRC norms and SoR is based on current and prevailing SoR 2019, Mizoram PWD.

10.4 Copy of Final Checklist cum Agenda Notes, as circulated/placed before the committee (along with all its enclosures) and PPT by State Government are at **Annexure VIIIA and VIIB**.

10.5 After detailed deliberations, the Committee recommended the project proposal "Improvement & Up-gradation of Difference facilities at Lengpui Airport, Mizoram" for sanction at a cost of Rs.19.59 crore.

11. Project proposal : "Construction of Two Residential Hostels at Zoram Medical College, Falkawn, Mizoram" under NESIDS- For Sanction.

11.1 The project was recommended for selection at a cost of Rs.20.00 crore in the 23rd meeting of IMC/NESIDS Committee. The SLEC in its meeting held on 10.11.2020 recommended the project proposal at cost of Rs.20.00 crore.

11.2 MoH&FW has recommended the proposal for sanction with an estimated cost of Rs.16.60 crore. The variation was again found to be on the basis of fixed, thumb-rule based rates as discussed in para 7 (project of Manipur) above. The Committee noted that MoHFW was not suggesting any changes to the design dimensions for the hostels, and the final cost of construction would be based on the tendered cost. Hence, reducing the estimated cost at this stage would merely be a paper exercise, with the cost reduction not having any unambiguously justified basis.

11.3 Copy of Final Checklist cum Agenda Notes, as circulated/placed before the committee (along with all its enclosures) and PPT by State Government are at **Annexure IXA and IXB**.

11.4 After due deliberation, the project "Construction of Two Residential Hostels at Zoram Medical College, Falkawn, Mizoram" under NESIDS was recommended by the Committee for sanction at the estimated cost of Rs.20.00 crore.

NAGALAND

12. Project/proposal of Government of Nagaland - Proposal for "Strengthening of Health Infrastructure of various Health Facilities in Nagaland" for selection under NESIDS.

12.1 The Acting Chief Secretary, Nagaland along with other concerned Officials of Health, Finance and Planning Department of State Govt. participated in the meeting through Video Conferencing. Representatives of Nagaland briefed the Committee about present condition in District Hospital in Zunheboto, Community Health Centre in Tseminyu & Primary Health Centre in Botsa and immediately required infrastructure/ machinery & equipment, and equipments in the state of Nagaland.

12.2 It was briefed to the Committee that Govt. of Nagaland proposed the project with estimated cost of Rs. 27.62 crore which was examined by the MoH&FW. MoH&FW recommended the cost of the project to Rs. 21.01 crore without supporting the components of "BLS ambulances" for CHC & PHC both and "Essential equipment for DH, Zunheboto". Acting Chief Secretary, Government of Nagaland presented detailed clarification on the comments of MoH&FW.

12.3 It was noted by the Committee that the project included work/procurement for hospitals based on three different locations, while NESIDS guidelines recommend projects to be taken up in single location. However Committee was of the view that merging the three projects into one, in this case, would be overall beneficial in terms of project management and execution, and hence recommended the project as a single project, with due waiver to be asked for from Competent Authority for the requisite "single location" clause of NESIDS guidelines.

12.4 The Committee noted that the project proposal was for selection under NESIDS, within the Normative Allocation of the State for 2020-21. Since little more than three months only remain in the current FY, the State Govt. was advised to fast track the project and, while following due process, to bring the project to the stage of sanction, well in time for the next meeting of the IMC/NESIDS Committee, likely to be held in mid January, 2021.

12.5 Copy of Final Checklist cum Agenda Notes, as circulated/placed before the committee (along with all its enclosures) and PPT by State Government are at **Annexure XA and XB**.

12.6 After due deliberation, the Committee decided to recommend the project "Strengthening of Health Infrastructure of various Health Facilities in Nagaland" for selection at a cost of Rs 21.01 crore, as well as for requesting approval of Competent Authority for project to be executed in three locations.

13. Project proposal: "In Service Teachers Training cum Examination Centre with Residential Facilities" in Nagaland - for selection under NESIDS.

13.1 The Acting Chief Secretary, Nagaland along with other concerned Officials of Education, Finance and Planning Department of State Govt. participated in the meeting through Video Conference. The representatives of the State Government briefed the Committee about the scope of the proposal and informed that proposal is to build Multi-Purpose State Teacher Training Centre to conduct short duration in-service teacher training and provide crash course programmes. The Centre will have multiple training and examination centre halls equipped with state of the art library, ICT and accommodation facilities to conduct in house training programmes. The centre is proposed to serve as Resource Centre for in-service teachers supported by Teacher Education Institutes (TEI).

13.2 Representative of Department of School Education and Literacy, Ministry of Education requested the State Government to clarify (i) Number of participants who will take training in one session or the training capacity of the Training Center (ii) Whether the accommodation will be dormitory or room. If room based accommodation, what will be the sharing criteria(iii) Detailed estimates of infrastructure and facilities along with civil drawings of the proposed center. Representatives of State Govt. explained the scope of proposal in detail. On the point of detailed estimates, committee viewed that this is the preliminary stage and if members are conceptually agreed to the proposal, detailed estimated will be obtained when DPR is prepared and state proposes the project for sanction. State Government submitted that views of Ministry of Education will be taken care while preparation of DPR of the project.

13.3 The Committee noted that the project proposal was for selection under NESIDS, within the Normative Allocation of the State for 2020-21. Since little more than three months only remain in the current FY, the State Govt. was advised to fast track the project and, while following due process, to bring the project to the stage of sanction, well in time for the next meeting of the IMC/NESIDS Committee, likely to be held in mid January, 2021.

13.4 Copy of Final Checklist cum Agenda Notes, as circulated/placed before the committee (along with all its enclosures) and PPT by State Government are at **Annexure XIA and XIB**.

13.5 After due deliberations, Committee recommended the project "In Service Teachers Training cum Examination Centre with Residential Facilities" of Nagaland for selection at a cost of Rs 20.00 crore.

TRIPURA

14. **Project proposal: "Improvement of road from Jatanbari to Mandirghat via Tirthamukh (L-13.775 KM)" under NESIDS- For Sanction.**

14.1 The Chief Secretary, Govt. of Tripura, along with Officials of State Govt. participated in the meeting through Video Conferencing (VC). The State Govt. gave detailed the salient features of the proposal.

14.2 The project was selected in the 23rd IC at a cost of Rs 56.45 crore. However, while preparing the DPR, it was found that the total cost of the project reduced to Rs 51.48 crore. The Committee noted that the SLEC had recommended the proposal at a cost of Rs 51.48 crore.

14.3 State Government brought out that forest clearance is pending only in respect of a very small segment of the proposed road. They were asked to submit a sketch/map showing the entire length of the proposed road alignment, with the area for which land acquisition is pending having been marked on it.

14.4 The Committee was of the view that State Government should submit 100% Land availability Certificate alongwith the forest clearance prior to award of work.

14.5 The representatives of the State Government present during the meeting addressed the observations of NITI Aayog and conveyed by MoRTH to the Ministry. The clarifications submitted by the State Government was found satisfactory.

14.6 The committee noted that the project proposal is supported by NITI Aayog.

14.7 Copy of Final Checklist cum Agenda Notes, as circulated/placed before the committee (along with all its enclosures) and PPT by State Government are at **Annexure XIIA and XIIB** respectively.

14.8 After due consideration of the proposal and detailed deliberations, the Committee recommended the project proposal of State Govt. of Tripura for sanction at a cost of Rs.51.48 crore subject to the condition that State Government shall submit 100% Land availability Certificate alongwith forest clearance prior to award of work.

15. Project proposal :“Procurement of Pulse Oximeter and Antigen Test Kits etc. for combating Covid 19 pandemic in Tripura” under NESIDS- For Selection

15.1 The Chief Secretary, Tripura, along with Officials of State Govt. participated in the meeting through Video Conferencing (VC). The State Govt. gave detailed the salient features of the proposal.

15.2 Copy of Final Checklist cum Agenda Notes, as circulated/placed before the committee (along with all its enclosures) and PPT by State Government are at **Annexure XIII A and XIII B** respectively.

15.3 The Committee noted that Ministry of Health and Family Welfare and NITI Aayog supported the following revised proposal of the State Government:-

15.4 The Committee noted that the project proposal was for selection under NESIDS, within the Normative Allocation of the State for 2020-21. Since little more than three months only remain in the current FY, the State Govt. was advised to fast track the project and, while following due process, to bring the project to the stage of sanction, well in time for the next meeting of the IMC/NESIDS Committee, likely to be held in mid January, 2021.

15.5 After due consideration of the proposal and detailed deliberations, the Committee recommended the project proposal of State Govt. of Tripura for selection at a cost of Rs. 3.90 crore.

16. With the above sanctions/selections, the position of Normative Allocation/ available Allocation of the NER States under NESIDS for F.Y. 2020-21 reflects as under:
